THE ANIMAL COUNCIL (TAC) was founded in 1991 to combat San Mateo County's (California) action to enact legislation forbidding cat and dog breeding, and mandating sterilization of all cats and dogs. TAC's goal is to seek positive, humane solutions to the challenges of animal rights activists through study, analysis and application of animal husbandry, statistics and law, and at the same time preserve human benefit from all species, breeds and registries.

In 1994, TAC has:

- Completed distribution of copies of the "Report to Congress on the Extent and Effects of Domestic and International Terrorism on Animal Enterprises" to members of the California legislature. This project was funded by a matching funds grant from The Cat Fanciers' Association, Inc.;
- Monitored California Board of Examiners in Veterinary medicine; California Department of Health Services Veterinary Public Health Unit; animal issues legislation in adjacent jurisdictions; meetings of the Peninsula Humane Society's Community liason committee, (mandated by the animal control contract); and the California Council of Companion Animal Advocates;
- Began distribution of position materials to the cities of San Mateo County; and
- Provided counsel to inquiring individuals, organizations and legislators.
