TAC's goal is to seek positive, humane solutions to the challenges of animal rights activists through study, analysis and application of animal husbandry, statistics and law, and at the same time preserve human benefit from all species, breeds and registries.

In 1996, TAC has:

- Requested and obtained a San Mateo County, California Grand Jury review of animal control and licensing.
- Lobbied San Mateo County Planning Commission regarding ordinance amendments for non-compliance with Planning and Building regulations.
- Lobbied City of Millbrae, California to prevent enactment of pet limit law.
- Monitored The California Veterinary Medical Board, the California Department of Health Services Veterinary Public Health Unit; animal issues in legislation in adjacent jurisdictions; meetings of the Peninsula Humane Society's Community Liaison Committee (mandated by the animal control contract); and the California Council of Companion Animal Advocates; and
- Provided counsel to inquiring individuals, organizations and legislators.
